

Taylor Prairie visits Aldo Leopold Nature Center

Taylor Prairie and Winnequah Elementary Schools were given the opportunity to go on an environmental adventure in early May. Thanks to the MGEF, who approved a grant written and submitted by **Jessica Parkos** (Kindergarten teacher at Taylor Prairie) and **Tracy Marks** (Membership Manager at Aldo), all Kindergarten classes from both schools were able to attend this trip (on separate days). The Winnequah kindergarten trip was coordinated by teacher **Renee Gaudreau**.

When Taylor Prairie arrived at Aldo on May 10th, the weather was a bit rainy and gloomy, but that didn't stop the Naturalists from showing the children a hands-on experience. The classes had 1 Naturalist per 10 students, so they were given more personal attention.

The program Taylor Prairie chose was Animals 2X2. Some of the activities the students engaged in involved sorting animal puppets into animal groups, looking at/learning about real pond creatures, watching an animal puppet show, and searching for/catching bugs and other critters underneath rocks and logs. The students learned about animal habitats, behavior, groups, and more. So much fun was had by all.

In the future, both schools plan to incorporate kindergarten field trips to ALNC into their science curriculums each year.

- Monona Grove High School science teacher **Juan Botella**, received a Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching in Washington, D.C., on September 7. The National Science Foundation selects one math and one science teacher from each state for the national award. In addition to a citation signed by the president, Botella received a \$10,000 award from the National Science Foundation. Botella has taught science at Monona Grove for eleven years.
- Madison jazz legend Doster "Doc" DeHaven passed away on
 August 12, 2016 at the age of 85 after a courageous battle with
 cancer. A legendary trumpet player, DeHaven was a fixture on the
 Madison jazz scene for over 50 years, having played with several

Matt Ward, an MG Success Story



Matt Ward, Class of 1997, was diagnosed with autism when he was 18 months old. In 1995, as a member of the MG Math Team, Matt earned the 7th highest score in the state on the American High School Mathematics Exam. As a result, he was invited to be on the Wisconsin All State Mathematics Team from 1996-98. He went on to earn a college transfer degree from Madison Area Technical College and then

transferred to UW Madison where he earned a BS in Mathematics in 2005. Matt is the first person UW staff are aware of to graduate from UW-Madison with a full-blown autism diagnosis. He is a good example of the importance of an inclusive educational environment for those on the autism spectrum.

Like the famous Temple Grandin, Matt thinks in pictures. Incoming communication has to be translated internally into a visual form and outgoing responses have to be converted from his internal pictures to language. This is complex and is part of the source of his communication struggles. For Matt, calculus and other math concepts are visual. He might have gone on to graduate school, but higher mathematical proofs became so abstract that he could no longer think of them in a visual way.

Ironically, even though Matt struggles to communicate, since 1998 he has been doing a lot of public speaking at conventions, conferences,

university classes, workshops and many other venues for the cause of autism awareness. He is able to do this because he can read a prewritten speech.

Today, Matt lives independently in a downtown Madison apartment and travels around the community by bus. He works part time at the downtown Madison library and has a small business selling math related artwork, working out of the "Artworking Studios" which support a number of disabled artists. Matt's communication struggles have made it difficult to find a job that uses his high math skills. He is an expert in chaos theory and fractal graphics which he uses in his artwork. He does calculus problems and builds many kinds of geometric figures for fun. He is a self-taught origami expert, making the most difficult, beautiful paper constructions. He is still "gloriously autistic".


