
MGHS Students Help to Share Extracurricular History

Last spring, members of Monona Grove High School's National Honor Society (NHS) volunteered their time to help gather information and load data to the school's new history touchscreens. Two touchscreen monitors are hung in the entryways to the school, and can be navigated to view historical team and individual accomplishments in fine arts, activities and athletics. The information displayed on these touchscreens can also be found online at www.mononagrove.touchpros.com.

"Our history and traditions are important to us, and have not always been well-kept over the history of the school," said Monona Grove High School Athletic and Activities Director **Jeff Schreiner**. "We don't have enough wall space or trophy case space to recognize all of the accomplishments throughout the years, so the touchscreens allow us to recognize these accomplishments for alumni to remember and current students to celebrate."

This is a big project, but an important one, Schreiner said. While freshmen and sophomores completed state testing, more than 70 juniors from Monona Grove's NHS assisted in the two-day project, on their own time. Every year, NHS participates in a service project, and with the completion of their previous project came the opportunity for these students to get involved in helping with the history touchscreens. "Who better to learn about our past successes than our current students," Schreiner commented. "We feel it will build a sense of pride for our future alumni, while also completing a needed task."

On the first day, students helped collect information from a variety of resources, to compile a history of fine arts, activity and athletics titles and awards earned by Monona Grove High School students. "I learned a lot

about Monona Grove's performance throughout the past and how we've become more successful in athletics, but also developments in the arts and extracurriculars as well," said MG junior Rachel Yundt. "It was really eye-opening to see how much has changed in the last 25 years of the school, since it's not something we get to learn about very often."

On day two, students entered the information collected into the website that now holds Monona Grove's athletics and activities history. "I really enjoyed being able to recognize the past athletes that won individual awards," said Daniel Scaife, junior at MG. "I personally helped entering in the names and achievements of young men and women who were in spring sports, and it was cool to see all of the distinctions if it be first team all-conference, or even the Silver Eagle Award. I enjoyed seeing the history in front of me, and helping it become more accessible to the public."

While there is more information to be gathered and entered into the touchscreens, Schreiner said the goal is that the school fall no further behind in maintaining these records. "The touchscreens are a great way to bridge and blend the past with the present, in a way that's accessible around the world," Schreiner said.

• Mary Frances Kelly, Platteville, Wis., died on Monday, Nov. 16, 2015, at Agrace HospiceCare, Fitchburg, WI. She was an Art teacher at Nichols and Maywood Elementary Schools and Winnequah Middle School from 1968 til 1980. In the summer of 1975 she petitioned the court and won a precedent setting case to become the first woman in Wisconsin to be allowed to reclaim her birth name after a marriage that produced a child. Only one other state had allowed that provision at that time.

Building Referendum Approved

In November, residents voted to approve the Monona Grove School District's \$57 million facilities and operating referenda. The vote allows the District to address its most critical needs: accommodating projected enrollment growth, further improving safety and security, and addressing significant capital maintenance needs.

The district has moved into the next phase of planning and design. Some maintenance work is expected by begin in the summer of 2019; the remainder of the projects, including construction of a new elementary school in Cottage Grove, will be complete by the fall of 2021.

According to Communications Director **Katy Byrnes Kaiser** "What makes the Monona Grove School District extraordinary is our shared commitment to students and their success, and our shared belief in the importance of a quality education. We look forward to this exciting new phase of our facilities work!"


